



COVID-19 Testing Frequently Asked Questions

The medical/technical team of the Unified Health Command, which is made up of Billings Clinic, St. Vincent Healthcare, RiverStone Health and Yellowstone County Disaster and Emergency Services, has compiled this information about COVID-19 testing available in Yellowstone County.

What kind of COVID-19 tests are available?

There are 3 kinds of COVID-19 tests that have been approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA):

- Molecular or PCR tests, also known as RNA tests
- Rapid antigen tests
- Antibody or serology tests

What is the difference between COVID-19 tests?

1. **Molecular, or PCR, tests** detect genetic material specific to the virus that causes COVID-19. This test uses samples collected from your nose, throat or saliva to determine if you have active COVID-19, can infect others and should be isolated. This test is so powerful that it may also detect remaining virus after you are no longer contagious.
2. **Rapid antigen tests** detect proteins on the surface of the virus that causes COVID-19 and results are known within 20 minutes. Like the PCR test, samples from your nose, throat, or saliva are used to determine if you have active COVID-19 and can infect others. Use of these rapid tests is most accurate if used in the first few days of symptomatic illness.
3. **Antibody, or serology, tests** can show if you have COVID-19 antibodies that develop during infection or from vaccination. These tests are not used to diagnose active COVID-19, and are available **ONLY** by physician's prescription and should not be used as a way to prove immunity to COVID-19.

Is there an accuracy concern with rapid antigen testing?

Rapid antigen tests are not as accurate as molecular/PCR tests and people who are infected with COVID-19 may have a negative test result. If you have COVID-19 symptoms and your rapid antigen test result is negative, your healthcare provider may order a molecular/PCR test to confirm the results. If your rapid antigen test is positive, there is no need to confirm the result with another test.

What type of test is recommended in Yellowstone County for detecting COVID-19?

The “gold standard” for detecting COVID-19 is the molecular/PCR test. While rapid antigen testing can quickly diagnose COVID-19 in someone who has symptoms, if this test is negative, you will likely need to be retested with a molecular/PCR test. Antibody testing is only available for people in specific circumstances with guidance from a healthcare provider.
